Rotary Club of Central Blue Mountains - Rotary's involvement with the townships of Bell, Clarence and Dargan - and the reconstruction of their community hall

Construction of a new community hall at 45 Petra Avenue, Clarence, is slow and behind schedule, but hopes are high for its completion in the second half of this year. The original hall was destroyed on December 27, 2019, when the townships of Bell, Clarence and Dargan were severely impacted by the 2019-20 Black Summer Bushfires.

Construction of the new hall is under the guidance of ABCD Inc, the Association of Bell, Clarence and Dargan, and Rotary has been deeply involved in providing finance.

Along with \$400,000 received from the NSW State Government, Upper Blue Mountains Sunrise Rotarian Phill Isaacs said \$140,000 came from RAWCS Bushfire funds, and \$110,000 from a Rotary Global Grant.

ABCD Inc. says the primary purpose of the Community Hall will be to house community events, classes, clubs, local social events and community markets. Proceeds from the hiring of the venue and the running of a market day café will be used to meet the annual operating costs of the Association, fund further community events, and meet the ongoing costs of the hall, and to provide casual employment on market days.

OBJECTIVES OF ABCD INC.

To provide an organisation by which landholders and residents of the localities of Bell, Clarence and Dargan can take collective action, which they believe is in the best interests of protecting and promoting the natural, scenic, cultural, economic and social values of these communities for current and future generations.





Generator provided



In May 2023, Central Blue Mountains Rotary obtained a District Grant of \$2,000, and then donated another \$2,000 to the cost of purchasing a large generator for the hall.

Extra funds were found to make up the purchase price of more than \$5,000.

Around 120 Rotarians and friends gathered for a magnificent feast at the Ramachandran's home in Castle Hill last Saturday (3.2.24). District 9685 Rotary Foundation Chair Haran and his wife Ahsha hosted the event to raise funds for the Foundation and to highlight some projects. A trio of cooks whipped up dozens of delicious dosai (Indian savoury pancakes). President of e-Club of Greater Sydney Anthony Miller and Rotary International Director Elect PDG Jennifer Scott presented Thi Thu Thuy Nguyen and Lesly Gunaratnam with Paul Harris Fellow recognition for their outstanding contributions and exceptional dedication to creating hope in the world.

The esteemed speakers were **Dr V Mano Mohan, Dr Lionel Bopage, Dr Prabu and Dr Juliana Chong**. They shared enlightening presentations on various collaborative initiatives that aim to make a positive impact on public healthcare, empowerment, and support for those in need. The scope is broad, an eye clinic, a haemo- dialysis unit which offers night time dialysis so people can continue to work and support their families, a unit for maxillofacial injuries and a laparoscopic procedure which means patients don't require ambulance transfers. Neonatal ventilators, portable ultrasounds and anaesthetic machines – imagine not having these basic items? In Sri Lanka there is so much malnutrition as there have been food shortages after the devastating tsunami in 2004, floods, droughts and wars. Malnourished mothers give birth to malnourished babies and the effects are devastating. They are being taught to include edible greens, yams and fruits and increase their diet diversity.

We learned of the problems faced by stateless Vietnamese living in Cambodia who have no access to healthcare or education. At a floating village the water is used for drinking, cooking, washing and toilet, creating much illness. They spoke about the financial probity and integrity that **The Rotary Foundation** has at its core and why it is important to bridge community differences so the poor get the help they need.




