#### Celebrate Melbourne's Indigenous culture

Melbourne, also known as Naarm in local Aboriginal language, stands on the traditional land owned by the people of the Kulin nation, which is made up of a collective of five Aboriginal clans: Wurundjeri, Boonwurrung, Wathaurrung, Taungurung and Dja DjaWrung. They have been living in the region for at least 40,000 years. Immerse yourself in Melbourne's ancient culture with a guided <u>Aboriginal Heritage Walk</u> in the serene inner-city greenery of the Royal Botanic Gardens. Learn more about the cultural stories, arts and agricultural practices of the Kulin nation at Melbourne Museum's <u>Bunjilaka Aboriginal Cultural Centre</u>.

The <u>Koorie Heritage Trust</u> is located at Federation Square, a modern-day meeting place on the banks of the Birrarung Marr (the "river of mists", also called the Yarra). Three times a week, you can join a walking tour of the Birrarung Wilam ("river camp"), to learn about the land's significance to the Kulin peoples and how the area has changed over time. The trust has a large collection of Koorie artworks, artifacts, photographs, and oral histories. Its shop offers authentic art, clothing, housewares, jewelry, and more designed or crafted by Koorie artists. All purchases support Koorie artists and designers.
